## Try At Home:

Make an animal ear headband! Take a sheet of colored or white paper and cut a strip or two. If using white paper, have your child color it. Place it around the child's head to make a band. Take the strip(s) off and staple to complete the headband. Take another sheet of paper and draw animal ears: half circle for bears, more pointed at the top for squirrels, etc. Have your child cut them out to practice their cutting skills. Staple them to the headband. Now your child is ready to play pretend! P.S. If it's not perfect that's okay! Your child will love it and the time they spent making it with you!

## We Rhymed:
